Listen up, sweet tooths: The Museum of Ice Cream makes its Windy City debut on the Mag Mile this summer.



he experiential Museum of Ice Cream has made a major splash around the world from New York City to Singapore—and this summer, MOIC expands its reach with the opening of a fourth outpost located here in Chicago.

Upon entering the vibrantly colorful
13,500-square-foot space, guests are transported into
a whimsical wonderland that channels the splendor
of sunny summer days best spent with a cold sweet
treat in hand. "The history of architecture, art and
revolutionary commerce [on the Mag Mile] over the
past 100 years makes this a perfect setting for the next
iteration of Museum of Ice Cream," says co-founder
and co-CEO Maryellis Bunn. Adds her counterpart,
Midwest-born Manish Vora, "It's a dream come true
to be building Museum of Ice Cream in a place that
birthed my love of ice cream, my passion for design
and my obsession with urban exceptionalism."

Chicagoans will feel at home inside the MOIC thanks to a few locally inspired attractions: the Sprink-L, inspired by our famed L trains; a massive dessert-themed putt-putt course with an eye-popping pink Chicago dog ice cream treat; and a 3,500-square-foot speakeasy. A single ticket rewards guests with four ice cream treats; a trip through 14 dessert-inspired installations such as the sprinkle pool, a water game room and five Chicago-exclusive spaces (there's a whole room dedicated to the Bean); and an Ice Cream Lab, where visitors can experiment with new flavors.

Bunn notes that this MOIC location allows families to enjoy the museum throughout the day and adults to revel at night—and rediscover the inner kid in them. "In a city bursting with entertainment, art, community and one of the most innovative culinary landscapes in the world," Vora says, "MOIC is thrilled to bring a bit more magic, joy and all things unexpected to Chicago."
